
Dear Security Equipment Corporation,

I am a Law Enforcement Training Specialist with the Ohio Attorney General's Office and have been so for over 20 years. I have also been involved in over 270 civil cases defending law enforcement and corrections officers. I estimate that in 40 - 50 of the cases aerosol agents have been one of the force options involved. I just finished another Aerosol Agent Instructor course at the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy with 22 student officer from 18 different departments. The first day of the course, I get contaminated to demonstrate to the students how to clear their eyes and air way to be able to still function (I am including a copy of my contamination record). I then demonstrate the correct decontamination procedures. You sent us a sample of your decontamination solutions Step I and II some time ago so I decided to demonstrate it in this class. I must say that I was pleasantly surprised by the effectiveness of your products. The clean-up was quick and efficient and very shortly after applying Step I and II, I was virtually pain free.

The second day of the course the student/officers get their contaminations with a number of products available for decontamination. The students who used your products were positively impressed by its performance. There was only one female officer who felt that her face got "hotter" after applying Step II but within 20 minutes even she was virtually pain free. A number of students asked about your product and seemed interested in purchasing it.
